THE GRAND MASTER'S MESSAGE

ello All. Were on the downward slope of another Masonic year as well as a record winter and snowfall depending in what part of the Province you reside in. I know in the Capitol region we have enough snow cover too last us for awhile. Reflections on what has happened so far brethren. Overall we are in good shape, a lot of encouraging signs starting to happen. The duties and demands of this Office are somewhat daunting from time to time so I am most happy this is only a one year term in our Jurisdiction. We shortly will have in place Automatic External Defibrillators or AED'S for short both on the upper as well as lower levels of the Masonic Memorial Centre building. We will have several building personnel combined of Stanroy Catering as well as Grand Lodge members trained in CPR and using the devices should the occasion arise. These devices will provide some measure of security and comfort should the need arise and have been provided by the Grand Lodge of Manitoba Freemasons to the MMC Limited. They are compatible and totally integratable with the equipment carried on Winnipeg Fire Paramedic Service vehicles. I have asked for Funds to be expended for improvements to the Archives to provide coding and recognition equipment to assist with records and cataloging of our treasures. We will as well undertake to place proper identification to the outside of our Landmark corner a Canadian Flag as well as a new up to date combination sign replacing the old decrepit model that's time has come. It will have both the Grand Lodge of Manitoba as well as Masonic Memorial Centre names on the surface as well as our address. The name on the tyndal facade will also be updated, its been a long process but will result in a fresh and a modern look which is long overdue.

I attended three Official Visits, these visits being most gratifying and extremely rewarding as of late. I have been most

pleased to have in the first two weeks of March been present and asked to personally present 50 year medals to four most deserving brethren of our Jurisdiction. Where else can a Grand Master witness both six new initiates into Freemasonry being conferred the EA degree the same night a Brother receives his 50 year jewel than Acacia 111. Congratulations to Worshipful Master Marcel Labosserie and his Officers for a great night and to Bro. Bert Jolly upon receiving his honour. What a great impact on our new brethren and those in attendance. Wor. Bro. Hans Brandenborg of Capitol 136 was our next recipient and both brethren have given tirelessly of themselves in many capacities to their respective lodges. In addition Bro. Ray Kirby of Capitol 136 was presented a 25 year members pin from the Lodge. Bro. Ray already is a recipient of the 50 year medal in 2003. On the 5th I was delighted to attend a homecoming of the Grand Master to my Mother Lodge Sturgeon Creek 145. What a special night this was brethren with a large turnout of Masons braving a cold chilly night. I would like to personally thank all the members who supported me and took the time to enjoy a memorable evening with us. For those who missed it the significance of the night was it fell on the third month, the fifth day in the year 2007 or in Masonic terms 3-5-7 an occurrence which will not happen for another 300 plus years. This in addition to the Irish theme of the festive board made for an excellent overall night of Freemasonry and a highlight in my GM vear. I presented Bro. Frank Johnson and Wor. Bro. Clifford Catton Perry Hardy with their 50 year jewels, once more two very deserving long time members and thanked them for their many years of service to the lodge and the Craft in general. To some within this jurisdiction who think nothing is getting done on Forward Planning and other areas please note these areas are more than being addressed and well looked after. At the Conference I have asked to address the body regarding the Canadian Human Rights Museum and where the Freemasons of Canada stand on potential involvement either monetarily or otherwise. I have been in regular contact with Ms. Kim Jasper on behalf of the Asper family. The scope of this project in itself is overwhelming and certainly appears to be out of our reach monetarily support wise. I will allow the Conference to shed some definition on our place in the Museum and what direction the Grand Master from Manitoba should indicate to the Governing Board of Directors. I have indicated we would be most pleased to be allowed the privilege to dedicate and perform a Grand Lodge Cornerstone ceremony for this building and have all the Grand Masters of Canada present in 2010 for the historic occasion.

The Grand Lodge Education & Training committee has been working extremely hard trying to enlighten and educate our next generation of Lodge Leaders. Please come out and support whole heartily their efforts as we all win. Upcoming seminars and educational opportunities need be embraced by those whom would benefit the most. Please devote the time required brethren.

I have attempted in my brief 9 months as your Grand Master to move the Craft in this jurisdiction forward. At the completion of my term at the Communication time will tell whether we have. I truly now, know the challenges of changing Freemasons in a timely fashion. Confirmed location in Winnipeg vet to be decided. A buffet style lunch will be served which will be the only cost assigned the lodges per member sent or any Masonic family attending. I have the privilege and pleasure of having MW Bro. Bob Conley, PGM Michigan and Masonic Renewal of North America Administrator and a most excellent Masonic presenter/ motivator coming to Winnipeg to conduct a Leadership Program and Planning seminar for our brethren. This is directed to all Lodge officers and I am opening up this sought after speaker to all the Masonic Family to benefit from the message and lessons learned elsewhere. We will include the presentation and all handouts as part of Grand Lodge sponsoring this event. Please mark your calendars and plan to come and learn. There will be a circular going out to the lodges for April and May summonses. Do not miss this opportunity to learn and share the lessons brethren.

I am going to try something new and unproven, see where it goes. Open Houses will be held in the following Masonic buildings towards the last week of April or first week in May on a Saturday 10am-2pm. Masonic Memorial Centre, East Kildonan Masonic Hall, Sturgeon Creek Masonic Hall, and the Dauphin Masonic Hall. We will be partnering with Canstar Community newspapers and ads will run leading up to the confirmed date to inform the public about Freemasonry. Lets see
