The Y Generation is who we are now having join our Craft, they are respectful of their elders in their families, they accept direction and are excellent candidates for the mysteries and privileges of Freemasonry. My challenge to the Masters and Officers of our lodges is to find a place for them in your folds and allow them to progress at their own pace, work with them not against them, together as a team we will all win. The Lodge Education Officer position continues to play a bigger part in renewed interest in our meetings. It is a very timely and well thought out plan which will encompass 3 years. We will combine this with the latest membership material and cd's from the Masonic Service

North Association and the America Renewal committee to help further promote the Craft. Brethren many of you will have already heard me speak on our lapse of marketing our very identifiable brands those being the Square & Compass and The Crescent & Sword together with a united message. We now have a wonderful opportunity to proceed with an accelerated public recognition program. I am in the planning stages for a Spring rollout of several Open Houses "Get To Know Freemasons in Your Communities". As I define the program we will keep the DDGM'S and Worshipful Masters updated as this takes shape.


