I hen I started to consider this message I was occupying a bed in Concordia Hospital. Things are on the mend, but I still have some strength to regain. When the Brethren of Vermillion Lodge became aware of the fact that I was not feeling up to par they decided to postpone my visit to them until May. A very considerate gesture, but not a surprising one as this is the kind of consideration I have been afforded all vear.

As the end of my term as your Grand Master draws near. I came across the following that has the best message I can ever relay to you.

Amendment to Constitution of Grand Lodge

Amendments to the Constitution and Regulations pursuant to the amendment, in June, 2005, of Article C-5 including the Right Worshipful Grand Archivist in the list of Grand Lodge Officers and the passage of the new constitutional Article C-39 dealing with the duties of the Grand Archivist.

Amend Article C-22: By replacing the words "or Grand Librarian" with the words ", Grand Librarian or Grand Archivist."

The Constitutional amendment is eligible for presentation at the Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of Manitoba Ancient Free and Accepted Masons to be held in the city of Winnipeg on the 2nd and 3rd of June in the year 2006.

NEWS FROM THE GRAND ARCHIVIST

Some time ago the Board of General Purposes approved a motion to the effect that Lodges and Districts could forward material more than seven years old and which were not required for the day-to-day operation of the Lodge or District to the Heritage Center (Archives).

At this time of the year some Lodge and District officers may be doing spring house-cleaning and considering sending material in for safekeeping in the Heritage Center. As Grand Archivist I would caution all to be extremely careful in terms of what you plan to consign to the trash bin. On March 23rd, while working through a box of material which, of first glance, appeared to be of little value, I found an item loosely wrapped in brown paper. On examination the item was a Master Mason's Certificate issued by Lodge No. 12 of the Grand Lodge of Upper Canada and dated '15 Feb'y 1817' to a Caleb Cook. The certificate is complete with a blue ribbon interwoven through cuts in the left side and an incomplete wax seal.

It would have been very easy to overlook this item which is now the oldest document in our collection.

The only items which should **NOT** be sent in to the Heritage Center are cancelled cheques, bank deposit slips and statements and outdated dues cards. Please leave the determination as to what should be discarded up to the Archives staff. Your cooperation is very much appreciated.

As archivist for the Grand Lodge of Manitoba I have been blessed with the contribution of a small metal trunk full of membership records. Unfortunately they are all relative to the Loyal Order of Orange, for which collection I have no mandate.

I have spoken to the Order's Toronto office and have been informed (several months ago) that they would have someone contact me but to date I have had no contact. As an archivist I hate to throw this material in the dumpster but must get rid of it.

If any of the brethren have contact with members of the Orange who would be interested in these records would you please have them contact me through the Grand Lodge office. Thanks for your help.
