#### THE GRAND MASTER'S MESSAGE

final opportunity to address you as your Grand Master. I thank the brethren of the jurisdiction for the privilege of having served in this chair for the year 2006-2007. The May message is always a bittersweet one to compile, while on one hand it marks the end of one's four year journey thru the Grand Lodge it is also the start of regaining ones personal time once more. I, despite some earlier setbacks am pleased that we as a Fraternity are starting to tum around in many areas and amthankful for some very dedicated and hardworking Brothers whom have assisted the process in coming together. I have stated repeatedly that we need to invest more money and time in providing quality programs, leadership training and seminars for our upcoming Lodge Officers. Investing in our own people has been traditionally just talk with very little action which has left us at times with Masters with very little knowledge in running an exciting, enthusiastic and vibrant lodge.

We held the most successful Wardens Workshop this jurisdiction has seen to date this year, I feel one of the reasons it was such was we, Grand Lodge covered the costs of the brethren giving up their time to attend. We still spend far too much time worrying about the almighty dollar and who should pay, its time to look at where we are at and what we wish to become. I have been the constant contact with the Midwest Con ference Masonic on Education for the past 12 years and have seen the programs implemented elsewhere in our sister jurisdictions in our Conference grow and prosper. Brethren the common denominator is they fund the programs, they don't expect their brethren to do so out of their own pockets. Its time we picked up the ball as effective, informative and consistent leadership should be our goal and mission. We all need to replace ourselves, in the Fire Service it is called

secession planning, look around you their is a Brotherto be, close to all of us.

The key components of a lodge in 2007 are limiting time dealing with business and past tense and more time learning and exploring who we are, what we are, where we have come from, and why after 300 some years were still here. Recent increases in lodges holding Masonic Education talks. speakers and interaction sessions has shown that the interest is there. In my inaugural speech I proposed returning to lodges hosting joint or multiple meetings together, I am thankful that some have indeed taken me up on that thought and I hope we expand on that concept next year. We have had some delightful joint functions to date and more will happen in the month of May. What a delight to be sitting amongst a full lodge hall brethren.

Success is measurable in many avenues depending upon the criteria applied. I set my bar very high in what I wished to try and accomplish and perhaps was a little unrealistic with my approach. Freemasons as a whole are still very slow and resistant to CHANGE, it has been my experience that the process needs some spark to get it to the next step. Our Education & Training Committee has worked very hard this year trying to instill enthusiasm, further light, and to advance the cause of educating our future leaders. Next year we will be bringing the Worshipful Masters into the fold with an inaugural meeting with the Grand Master elect to lay out the PLAN for the year and ensure all Masters are on line and in the same direction.

I have spent considerable time working to restore the Masonic Family tree as a whole this year. A lot of our brethren who are members of the Appendant bodies to Freemasonry seem to forget the Grand Master in power is the overseer of all who hold a dues card, which is the foundation

block of their existence. I am most pleased to report our combined efforts have corrected some misconceptions and set straight hopefully forever, the structure is directed from the top down not the bottom up. This certainly by far is anything but an ego trip for the Brother occupying the chair of Solomon but in any organizational structure their needs to be order and compliance with order as without this the whole context collapses. There are some whom have a difficult time grasping this concept, until such time it is changed we will continue to provide governance from the Chair. Some of the upstarts whom have grown tired of conforming to the rules suggest Grand Lodge is only here to serve the Lodges, while I do not disagree each Worshipful Master upon installation gives his complete assent upon oath and honor to the Ancient Charges & Regulations and is expected to not only comply but maintain and uphold the same. To do otherwise is a disservice to not only ones selfbut the Craft and Grand Lodge in general and a violation of the Obligations one takes.

The month of May comes on the heels of a terrific April for the Fratemity, in no particular order. We restored the Charter to Seven Oaks Lodge #148 under the leadership of W Bro. Dan Regan and a very dedicated small corps of officers. There numbers may be small in starting off but the determination and dedication I witnessed throughout the process to completion with them receiving their Charter from me was very encouraging brethren. The Master had gone through some very difficult personal time and I feel, is a terrific example of a Freemason who has given selflessly of himself to help another. Good on you Daniel, many good years of Freemasonry to you and the brothers of the lodge from the Grand Master, we are all proud of you. The Master Masons workshop was held and 26 brethren were in attendance. The Grand Line stopped in for a quick visit before returing to the All Canada Conference where we were engaged in sessions with our counterparts from east to west. We then Instituted Phoenix Lodge U.D in a ceremony at Shrine House with an old friend and lodge brother W Bro. Jack Goods assuming the Master's chair. To him

and his officers we wish you as well, all the wonders of building the new lodge into a vibrant and exciting place to be. It is exciting to have a Masonic Lodge now meeting in our Shrine building. Best wishes to all concerned. The Grand Master as promised attended the inaugural meeting of Phoenix April 12th and we had a good gathering of brethren in attendance from the First Masonic District lodges as well as my DDGM of the Thirteenth RW Bro. Harry Rosenbaum. The Master conducted the lodge in the FC degree as Millenium was present with a Fellowcraft brother. A short business meeting took place which included the first petition for membership being received and the Grand Master provided some Masonic education and updates from within the Grand Lodge to those assembled. All in all a great night for the Craft and Freemasonry in general.

The Line Officers attended another regular meeting of Templum Sion #186 which featured Bro. Albo presenting a followup to the Legislative Building which better enabled one to apply the contents of the book Hermetic Code through a visual power point presentation which was coloruful, interactive and well done. I issued a dispensation for the members of the lodge to attend the book launch wearing Masonic regalia which by all accounts went off very well and was seen as a positive for the Craft. The Grand Lodge is in contact with the Free Press publisher to feature the book and a story for the Grand Lodge Website, the Webmaster will be directed to look after getting it up and running once details are worked out. Of considerable note it has an inclusion at the last pages of the book titled What Are The Masons. The Grand Master has followed up a letter of thanks to the Free Press for this inclusion and portraval of the Craft and the project as a whole on behalf of the Freemasons of Manitoba. It makes a great gift brethren to someone a Freemason ornot.

We hosted a Masonic Family meeting on the 14th with the adult appendant bodies. Plans are underway and in place for a feature wall in the lobby of MMC to explain the MASONIC STRUCTURE to those whom wonder while visiting our building. I have requested each appendant body to supply a 4-6 line message best explaining the mission and purpose of their group. This will be then collated together and given to Belle Fosh Signs to create for us. Along with this signage we will have clear lucite literature holders installed for handouts. Its long overdue, we have sometimes thousands of people each week go through the building not knowing anything about us. The public access AED Defibrillator program will soon be installed and in place along with signage identifying spotting Strokes and Heart Attacks. The new sign identifying Grand Lodge of Manitoba and Masonic Memorial Centre will shortly be underway and the installation of a flagpole with our countries flag will be completed at the same time.

The week of April 15th-21st I was in Indianapolis for the Fire Department Instructors Conference and the following week then returned once more to Indiana as the Senior Grand Warden and I journeyed down to Evansville for the Midwest Conference on Masonic Education which we are members of An exciting interchange of information and programs we participated in.

The month of May features some exciting times, of which will be the highlight the Leadership Seminar featuring MW Bro. Bob Conley PGM Michigan, see insert, Saturday May 12th. The charter presentation to Templum Sion #186 will be Saturday May 19th at MMC @ 10 am in the Canada Room. This will be an Emergent Communication of Grand Lodge with Officers presiding. On the Saturday 26th we are conducting a Cornerstone Ceremony dedicating Shrine House to Freemasonry @ 2pm I am going to hold the Grand Masters Divine Service Sunday May 27th in conjunction with the dedication and installation of Cornerstone plaque at All Saints Anglican Church in Gladstone. We will join the congregation for morning service and share some fellowship while were there. Please check the Website or call the G.L. Office for confirmed times. All Freemasons are welcome to join the Grand Master and help celebrate a memorable time in the Grand Lodge. It is a hectic pace right up until the Annual Communication to which you all our invited.

For those of you whom are master masons and at present only belong to your Craft Lodge it may be hard to understand that the Grand Master has the welfare and best interests of all Free masons at heart whether they be Shrine, Scottish Rite, Royal Arch Masons, brethren in the Eastern Star and as such along with the day to day business of overseeing the 51 lodges and any problems that occur provides guidance and good counsel to the Craft as a whole.

The duties and responsibilities as Grand Master sometimes are unpleasant as we mirror regular society, in carrying out the mandate of the GM I have tried to lead by example and deal with the many issues ones confronted with during the year with tact and decorum, and in doing so hope I have contributed some small part in our overall mission and relevance to society today.

In closing I would be remiss if I didn't recognize and acknowledge my wonderful wife, Lady Marie and thank her for the many hours, days and evenings she has not only given up to me, but for her untiring support, counsel, and being my sounding board on those difficult days throughout the 4 year journey to the Grand East. As the First Lady of Freemasonry for 2006-2007 I could not have asked for a better partner on the ascension through the chairs. Together we have enjoyed representing the 3300 brethren and their families in the Grand Lodge of Manitoba. Thank You all. Yours in the faith.
