WARDENS' WORKSHOP

Wherever you are on your ascension to the East in your Lodge the enormity of the challenge slowly grows as the years pass by. Each yeas as you progress to a higher chair the brethren congratulate you and wish you good luck. An early president of the USA, Thomas Jefferson, made this observation regarding luck: "*I'm a great believer in luck and I find that the harder I work the more of it I have.*" The trick is not to work harder but to work <u>smarter</u>! Ok, how do we do that?

Your Grand Lodge has been presenting a Wardens' Workshop for a number of years. They continue to refine it, ensuring that it is relative to the needs of today's officers. They recognize that one does not learn to be a Worshipful Master in a year - it is a process that starts at Initiation and ends long after he has completed his term as the Immediate Past Master. This course speaks specifically to the duties of the Wardens, the Director of Ceremonies and the Worshipful Master. The earlier one begins to prepare himself, the more likely he is to respond to the needs of his brethren, thereby contributing to the well being of both his Lodge in particular and Freemasonry in general.

WEBSITE CALENDAR OF EVENTS

Over the coming summer we will be implementing a change to the format of the *Events Calendar* page on the Grand Lodge website. We will send that person a link to the site where the information can be inserted. The results will be embedded into a non-public 'practice' page on the Grand Lodge website immediately. When the participants are comfortable with the process we will create a permanent, 'public' page, accessible by anyone who browses our site.

Please note that Grand Lodge is not in a position to offer technical support for this process. We ask that you designate your representative soon so that he may familiarize himself with the ins and outs of using this system. Since the public will not have access to the resulting web page until the fall (the volunteer contributors will, of course) now is the time to experiment and make mistakes! Please take advantage of this opportunity to let others know what we're doing.
