MW Bro. Ted Jones, Grand Master 2008 - 2009

Ted Jones grew up in Austin, Portage la Prairie and later Winnipeg where he attended General Wolfe and Daniel McIntyre Collegiate. He then joined the RCAF and set off to see the world. He saw a good portion of it, enjoying a career which saw him promoted to Chief Warrant Officer, which is the highest rank a noncommissioned officer can hold and culminated with the investiture as a member of the 'Order of Military Merit.' Other highlights included a stint with the 'Golden Centennaires', our 1967 Centennial Aerobatic Team.

Ted was always involved in sports, either actively or as a supporter. He was named Executive Director of Skate Canada and served in that capacity for ten years.

Masonically, MW Bro. Jones was initiated into Freemasonry in Ancient Landmark Lodge No. 3 in 1992 and served as their Worshipful Master in 1999. He decided to join the Scottish Rite and received his 32nd degree in 1994. About the same time he was initiated into Khartum Shrine, joining the Khartum Komedians in 1995. In 2006 he was invited to join the Royal Order of Scotland. He was elected to the Board of General Purposes in 2002 and in 2004 was presented with the GM's Meritorious Service Award. The following year he was elected Junior Grand Warden and began his progression to his present position.

Ted and Shirley celebrated their Golden Wedding Anniversary in 2007. Their family includes Gay-Lynne (Texas) and Joy-Anne, Mrs. Wayne Boudreau and their two sons; Colten and Brett.

Bro. Ted brings a unique combination of 'farm boy ingenuity', military 'know how' and business 'savvy', all of which will serve him and the fraternity well as he leads us for the next year.

The Grand Masters (or their representatives) from the Grand Lodges of British Columbia and the Yukon, Alberta, Minnesota, North Dakota, Saskatchewan were present. The Masonic Family was represented by the Royal Arch Masons, Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite, Royal Order of Scotland, Red Cross of Constantine, Khartum Shrine, Sphinx Temple - Daughters of the Nile, Eastern Star, White Shrine of Jerusalem, Khartum Ladies Auxiliary, Job's Daughters and the Order of Demolay.

The Flag of Canada was presented by MW Bro. Brian J. Bailie, the Flag of the United States of America was presented by MW Bro. Tom Jackson of the Grand Lodge of Minnesota and the Union Jack was presented by MW Bro. Stuart Allen.

A Memorial Service was held on behalf of those departed brethren under the capable direction of the Grand Chaplain, RW Bro. Junn Manalang. Special note of the loss of MW Bro. Dr. J. Lewis Beckstead and MW Bro. John M. Reid, Past Grand Masters of Manitoba.

A petition to form a new lodge to be called Fil-Can Cabletow Lodge to meet at the E. K. Masonic Temple. 205 Kimberly Avenue, Winnipeg was approved by the Board of General Purposes on November 16th 2007. An Emergent meeting was held on February 22nd 2008 in the City of Winnipeg to Institute Fil-Can Cabletow Lodge U.D. Lodge to meet at the E.K. Masonic Temple, 205 Kimberly Avenue, Winnipeg.

A Petition for a Charter to approve a Motorcycle Club to be called "The Widows Sons" was presented to the Board of General Purposes on March 14th 2008 and was regularity moved and passed at the Grand Lodge Communications June 7, 2008. A Petition for Charter was presented by Phoenix Lodge U.D. at the April 18th Board of General Purposes meeting and approved - MW Bro. Jones has set the date of November 13, 2008 for the Consecration.

The Masonic Foundation has received \$48,874.35 which was raised from contributions during the annual fund-raising campaign, exceeding the target figure of \$37,200.00 which included administration costs. This has been distributed to the following for Masons Care Program - Vehicle Fund, Rehab for Children and KidsID - It is regretted that there is still only a very small proportion of our membership that contribute to this annual charitable project. The brethren of this Jurisdiction unanimously approved as their Special Charitable Projects for 2008 the sum of \$42,200.00, to be distributed to the purchase of a Masons Care van \$30,000.00, and to support the Rehabilitation Centre for Children the sum of \$6,000.00 and the administration costs for mail out and handling of the program.

The Benevolence Committee received several requests for assistance. We have to date expended \$21,300.00 this past year which includes per capita dues assistance waiver of \$3,550.00 for 71 of our Brethren on benevolence grounds, and anticipate that an additional \$3,500.00 may be called upon before December 31st of this year.

The Masonic Enhancement Committee approved grants in the amount of \$18,778.00 to assist the Disaster Relief, Youth and Individual Lodges with their community projects.

During 2006 Cancer Care drivers made 15,517 trips transporting 618 patients to and from their homes to the hospital for treatment. Of these, Mason drivers made 8,701 trips. Currently, there are 38 active drivers in Winnipeg. Brandon, with a total of 17

drivers made 373 trips between Brandon and Winnipeg transporting approximately 138 patients. Due to an increase in the number of cancer patients from Brandon requiring transportation to Winnipeg it was decided to purchase another van to be based in Brandon. The fleet now has a total of five vans.

We face an ever increasing pressure on per capita, in spite of reducing expenses, because of declining membership. Per capita is simply the cost of operating Grand Lodge, less interest and other income, divided by the number of members. Our initial budget for 2009 showed a deficit of nearly \$12,000. The Board of General Purposes debated at great length an appropriate response and looked at several options. After a long debate it was recommended by the Board to recommend a \$5.00 increase, which is sufficient to cover the deficit. As approved at the Annual Communications the percapita assessment will be \$60.00 as of January 2009.

The WILLIAM DOUGLAS MEDAL, for "Exceptional Service to the Craft" by a Mason of this Jurisdiction who has not attained the rank of Worshipful Master, was awarded to Brother Gordon Jule Christiaens of Capitol Lodge No. 136.

The GRAND MASTER'S AWARD FOR MERIT for contribution to the "Craft and Mankind" was presented to RW Bro A.R. (Sandy) Tennant of Millennium Lodge No. 182.

The Grand Master's CERTIFICATE OF MERITORIOUS SERVICE for "Exceptional Service to the Craft" by a member of a Lodge in this Jurisdiction, was awarded to W Bro. Troy Walton of Brandon Lodge No. 19 presently serving with the military in Afghanistan.

The special Mason Care Medal (J.E. Reesor Bingeman Medal "Cancer Driver Award") was presented to 24 members with 5 years or more service. There are a number of medals yet to be presented. The Grand Lodge of Manitoba was accorded special recognition for this successful driver program by Mr. Mark MacDonald, the CEO of the Canadian Cancer Society.

A Grand Lodge dinner and entertainment was held in the Hilton Hotel Airport Hotel on Friday, June 6th and the ladies enjoyed a planned program prepared for them by the Grand Master's lady, Mary Butchart.

The Open Installation of Grand Lodge Officers was conducted by MW Bro. Stephen Kane and assisted by Past Grand Masters on Saturday, June 7th. A reception in honour of the newly installed Grand Master, MW Bro. E.H. (Ted) Jones followed.

We wish to pay our compliments to RW Bro. Rudy Weidenbacher and his assistants from the Reception and Arrangements Committee who organized all business and social events and saw that they all ran smoothly.

The 134th Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of Manitoba will be held in the city of Winnipeg on Friday and Saturday, June 5th and 6th, 2009.
